#### Water is a vital resource for which there is no substitute

At the same time, it must be managed sustainably, within its finite limits, to ensure water security tomorrow.

## Local and regional authorities are on the frontline in dealing with water issues

Rapid urbanization, climate change, landscape development, ageing infrastructure, increasing population, rising living standards and recurrent pollution, all these challenges are exerting more and more pressure on water resources. As a consequence, global water security is threatened, social well-being is affected, economic growth is hampered and the safety of our environment is at risk. In this context, nurturing political will for sustainable urban water management is as important as getting the hardware right.

### Many international frameworks for many challenges

In recent years, numerous global agreements have been elaborated: the Sendai Framework, the New Urban Agenda, the Sustainable Development Goals, the Paris Agreement... Cities and regions often lack guidance on how to achieve them locally, contribute to nationally set targets and implement concrete solutions. Mayors will need to develop new strategies to deliver on all agreements while adopting an integrated approach to overcome political, financial, technological and behavioral barriers.
